The fifth notable event mentioned in the fourth paragraph should be changed from “(5) An *Educational Day* was established in 2005 to take place 1 day prior to each WCPG for reviews of different aspects of the field for new investigators beginning work in psychiatric genetics, as well as the informed public and media.”

To the following corrected sentences: “(5) Educational Sessions at the WCPG may have had their first appearance at the 2004 Dublin, Ireland congress. An *Educational Day* was established in 2005 to take place 1 day prior to each WCPG for reviews of different aspects of the field for new investigators beginning work in psychiatric genetics, as well as the informed public and media.”
